HOW TO PARTICIPATE ...

All agencies whose volunteer programs are registered with VAC are invited to participate at no cost.

- An agency clearly defines how a professional volunteer might help.
- An agency then submits an "Agency Request for Skillsbank Volunteer" form at least one month prior to beginning the task.
- Skillsbank staff attempts to identify an appropriate volunteer.
- 4. The volunteer is referred to the agency for an interview. Sufficient time must be allowed to discuss the assignment, volunteer skills, agency's expectations. If there is agreement on the task, the volunteer is placed in that agency.
- 5. Agencies will be expected to:
 - · provide agency orientation
 - assign appropriate personnel to work with the volunteer
 - keep a record of the volunteer's time on the task
 - consult Skillsbank staff should problems arise
 - notify Skillsbank staff of changes in status of the volunteer and when the assignment is complete
 - · complete the program evaluation form
