CREATING A LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION
ON VOLUNTEERISM AND CITIZEN PARTICIPATION
AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION THEREFOR

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- SECTION 1. Title 22 of the General Laws entitled "General
 Assembly" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following chapter:

 CHAPTER 15
 PERMANENT COMMISSION ON VOLUNTEERISM
 AND CITIZEN PARTICIPATION
- 7 <u>22-15-1. Permanent Commission Composition. --</u> There is 8 hereby created a permanent commission on volunteerism and citizen 9 participation consisting of nine (9) members: five (5) of whom 10 shall be from the house of representatives, not more than four 11 (4) from the same political party to be appointed by the speaker; 12 four (4) of whom shall be representative of the general public to 13 be appointed by the governor from the existing membership of that

- 2 Creating a Special Legislative Commission to Study the Feasi-
- 3 bility of Establishing an Office on Citizen Participation Within
- 4 the Legislative Branch of State Government and Making an Appro-
- 5 priation Therefor." Vacancies which shall arise in said public
- 6 membership shall be appointed on a rotating basis by the speaker
- 7 and the senate majority leader. Vacancies in the legislative
- 8 membership shall be appointed by the speaker.
- Forthwith upon passage of this act, the members of this com-
- 10 mission shall meet at the call of the speaker of the house and
- 11 organize and shall select from among themselves a chairman.
- 12 <u>22-15-2. Purpose. --</u> The purpose of said commission shall
- 13 include utilization of volunteerism and citizen participation
- 14 including, but not limited, to:
- 15 (a) encouraging a closer working relationship between the
- 16 state government and citizenry by promoting volunteerism through-
- 17 out the state;
- 18 (b) creating a more meaningful experience for volunteers;
- 19 (c) enhancing the quality of life for all the citizens
- 20 within the state through the use of volunteerism and citizen
- 21 participation.
- 22 22-15-3. Compensation Departmental Cooperation. -- The
- 23 membership of said commission shall receive no compensation for
- 24 their services, but shall be allowed their travel and necessary
- 25 expenses. The commission may engage such clerical, technical and
- 26 other assistance as it may deem necessary, and spend such other
- 27 funds as is necessary to accomplish its purpose.
- 28 All departments and agencies of the state shall furnish such
- 29 advice and information, documentary and otherwise, to said com-
- 30 mission and its agents as is deemed necessary or desirable by the
- 31 commission to facilitate the purposes of this resolution.
- 32 The director of administration is hereby authorized and
- 33 directed to provide suitable quarters for said commission.

22-15-4. Report. -- The commission shall report its find-1 ings and recommendations to the general assembly annually. 2 The sum of thirty-eight thousand dollars 3 SECTION 2. (\$38,000.) is hereby appropriated, out of any money in treasury, 4 not otherwise appropriated, to carry out the purposes of this act 5 and, for the purpose of employing such staff and purchasing such 6 materials as the commission deems necessary; and the state con-7 troller is hereby authorized and directed to draw his orders upon 8 9 the general treasurer for the payment of such sum, or so much thereof as may be deemed necessary from time to time, upon 10 receipt by him of properly authenticated vouchers. 11

12 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

2	commission whose purpose it shall be to utilize volunteers and
3	citizen participation in government and who shall report to the
4	legislature annually; there is \$38,000. appropriated for the pur-
5	poses of this act.
