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I. UNDERSTANDING FAMILY VOLUNTEERISM

INTRODUCTION

In 1993, The Volunteer Center of United Way of Metropolitan Atlanta was awarded a grant from the Points of Light Foundation to develop a special initiative, Family Matters, which focuses on promoting and supporting family volunteerism. Atlanta is one of six sites around the country participating in this national Points of Light Foundation project.

United Way of Metropolitan Atlanta believes family volunteerism is critical to building and strengthening our communities. We are committed to working with families and nonprofit agencies and organizations to promote and create volunteer opportunities for families. Through volunteer experiences, families can strengthen their bonds while contributing to solutions for critical social problems.

Family volunteering is not new. For years families have been sharing their time and talents within the community. Some of the sharing has been formal, such as organizing for natural disasters, but much sharing has been informal, such as providing meals or mowing the lawn for a sick neighbor. Whether formal or informal, sharing such as this represents family volunteering. Unfortunately, in recent years the potential of family volunteering has not been fully recognized by nonprofit agencies and organizations and other entities who involve volunteers in their work. Those who involve families often do so accidentally rather than through planning or promotion.

This guide was written to make volunteering as a family fun and easy. Not only will you find practical tips for volunteering, you will find many volunteer opportunities.

Family Matters' mission is:

To be the advocate for family^{*} volunteering in Atlanta by developing, encouraging and promoting family volunteering to create a legacy for community involvement for future generations.

For the purposes of this guide, Family Matters defines "family" as two or more people who consider themselves a family.

VOLUNTEERING AS A FAMILY

Family volunteerism strengthens families and our community by contributing solutions to critical social problems. There are many kinds of families, each of which may volunteer in any number of ways.

WAYS TO VOLUNTEER:

Every member of the family performing the same activity at the same time.

Family members going to a site together but performing different tasks.

Taking on a long-term project and rotating the family members who participate each week.

Part of a family, such as one parent and one child, participating in an activity.

For the non-custodial parent in a divorce, volunteering may be a way for the family to spend quality time together during regularly scheduled visits.

Your extended family, such as aunts, uncles and cousins, participating in the volunteer experience.

EXAMPLES OF FAMILIES:

Adult Family: two adult sisters, spouses, parent and adult child, etc.

Family with High School Age Teen: parent with teenage child, grandparents with teenage child, mentor or guardian with teen, two high-school sisters, etc.

Family with Middle School Age Children: parent with middle school son, grandparent with high-school and middle-school grandchildren, etc.*

Family with Elementary School Age Children: parent and step-parent with middle-school and elementary-school daughters, uncle with elementary-school niece, etc.*

Family with a Child or Children Younger Than School Age: parents with high-school and preschool son and daughter, grandparent with grandson, etc.

* It is assumed that all children younger than highschool age will be supervised by an adult.

What greater gift can we give our family than a legacy of caring for one another?

BENEFITS OF FAMILY VOLUNTEERING

The benefits to individual family members and to our community are great when families serve as volunteers. Outlined below are the benefits for each group:

BENEFITS TO THE FAMILY:	BENEFITS TO OUR COMMUNITY:
Highlights and reinforces the family's values, while building confidence and developing "family esteem."	Family volunteers can play a key role in addressing a community's critical social issues.
Gives children opportunities to share time and talents and to acquire new skills.	Family volunteer opportunities provide the means for busy families to work for their community.
Encourages communication between family members, sharing a common goal, seeing each other in a new light.	Families of volunteers significantly increase the pool of potential volunteers. Families who volunteer with children create a lasting legacy for volunteerism in generations that follow.
Teaches children lifetime lesson that by giving to others they put their own problems in perspective.	Families who volunteer together share the experience of giving to their community and of gaining a sense of fulfillment from the results.
Allows family members to capture that elusive but desired goal of spending "quality time" together.	Volunteer families are strengthened, and stronger families result in a healthier community.

Family volunteering offers tremendous potential for ongoing social change. A recent **INDEPENDENT SECTOR** study shows that children who volunteer become adults who volunteer, who pass these values down to the next generation.

II. HOW TO VOLUNTEER

GETTING STARTED

Often the most difficult part of getting started is taking the first step. By following these basic steps you should be on your way to a successful experience. Check the following page for "helpful hints."

The Fast Track to Family Volunteering

Discuss with your family the <u>kinds of volunteer activities</u> you all would enjoy.
Determine what <u>times are available</u> for your family members to volunteer.
Use the "Project Listings" starting on page 9 to <u>review</u> <u>projects</u> that need your family's assistance, or review the matrix of all projects inserted in the index.
<u>Call the contact person</u> listed at the agencies or projects your family is interested in. Discuss your interest in the project and ask any additional questions your family may have.
Once the family agrees on a project, <u>GO FOR IT!</u> ! Make all necessary arrangements with the contact person.
When you complete the project, be sure to <u>review the</u> <u>experience as a family</u> . You may wish to use the log sheet included in this book.

Preparation:

- Start slowly. Consider a one-time or short-term volunteer activity before making a long-term commitment.
- Consider doing your family volunteer activity with other families in the PTA or with religious, neighborhood or workplace groups.
- Use the Project Selection table provided on page 7 to list the projects you are considering.
- Consider volunteering as a family, but at different times to accomodate conflicts in schedules.
- Remember that even the youngest of your family members are full of life and can be a ray of sunshine to an elderly person.
- Ask all the questions necessary when contacting the agency or project volunteer site; and if necessary, attend an orientation. If volunteering with children, inquire if there are any special health or safety considerations.

The Experience:

- While at your volunteer project, talk openly with your family about your experience. If children are part of your family, insure they are contributing, and give them positive feedback.
- Have fun! It is not only allowed but should be a requirement.
- Talk about your experiences on your drive home, during your meals or whatever time is available to your family. Adults and children alike will benefit from the opportunity to "process" your volunteer experience.
- Keep a journal of your family volunteer activities and experiences. A Family Volunteering Log is provided for your convenience on page 55 of this guide.
- Be proud of what your family has accomplished. Your "Family Esteem" will continue to climb as you repeat your service to others on future projects.

CHOOSING A VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

This section contains a listing of agencies that are excited about working with you and your family. Our objective is to help you find an activity that will be *meaningful* for you and *beneficial* to the agency and to those it serves.

The family volunteering opportunities in this manual are listed by category and within each category by age of volunteers accepted. Each listing contains information which should be helpful to you in making selections. At the end of this book is an alphabetical index of agencies sponsoring the project.



- You might consider agencies which you, your family members or friends may know of that provide the type of services which interest your family. You could also call Family Matters at the United Way at **527-3599** for ideas. Call agencies or organizations that you are considering, and discuss your family's desire to help them out.
- Even if you cannot identify an agency, you can still develop your own project. As a family, brainstorm ways that you could impact your common interests.

For example:

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If your area of interest is working with seniors, you may know of a homebound senior in your neighborhood who would enjoy a meal which your family could prepare and deliver.

If your area of interest is the environment, your family could sponsor a flower bed at your place of worship or at a neighborhood park.

If your interest is helping those who are hungry, your family could do a neighborhood food drive. There are countless agencies and groups who need food to distribute.

The possibilities for your family to get involved in your community are limitless. It may take a little effort, but the rewards are priceless.
